PROCLAMATION

Melanoma and Skin Cancer Awareness Month

May 2025

WHEREAS: It is imperative that communities across Canada be reminded of the

importance of sun safety; and

WHEREAS: Over-exposure to UV radiation is one of the major causes of melanoma and

non-melanoma skin cancers; and

WHEREAS: Skin cancer is the most common of all cancers. It is expected 1 in 6 Canadians

born in the 1990s will get skin cancer in their lifetimes; and

WHEREAS: Many people seek sun without taking the advisable precautionary measures

and are unaware that any darkening of skin colour, including a tan, is indicative

of UV damage; and

WHEREAS: Skin self-examinations should be performed on a monthly basis because skin

cancers are highly treatable when detected early; and

WHEREAS: Save Your Skin Foundation is an organization dedicated to the fight against non-

melanoma skin cancers, melanoma and ocular melanoma through nationwide

education, advocacy, and awareness initiatives.
